Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

Notes to Financial Statemets for the year ended March 31, 2022

CORPORATE INFORMATION

Nagarjuna Agricultural Research and Development Institute ("the Company") was incorporated under Section 25 of The Companies Act 1956. The license under Section 8 of the Companies Act, 2013 was surrendered. Consequently Nagarjuna Agricultural Research and Development Institute Pvt Ltd ("the Company") came into effect from 17th October 2017 . Now the main objects of the Company are to undertake the business of export, import, trading, manufacturing, vending, stocking, transporting and purchase of Plant and machinery, Equipment, Commodities of all types and merchandise of all kinds. During the year the Company has not carried out any

The company is a Associate of Nagarjuna Fertilizer and Chemicals Limited.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

2.1. Basis of preparation:

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) notified under the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 in line with the decision of the holding company.

The financial statements have been prepared on a historical cost basis and are presented in Indian Rupees ('INR').

Current versus non-current classification

Any asset or liability is classified as current if it satisfies any of the following conditions:

- the asset/liability is expected to be realized/settled in the Company's normal operating cycle;
- the asset is intended for sale or consumption;
- the asset/liability is held primarily for the purpose of trading; iii.
- the asset/liability is expected to be realized/settled within twelve months after the reporting period; iv.
- the asset is cash or cash equivalent unless it is restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at ٧. least twelve months after the reporting date;
- in the case of a liability, the Company does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for at vi. least twelve months after the reporting date.

All other assets and liabilities are classified as non-current.

Cash and cash equivalents 2.3.

Cash comprises cash on hand and demand deposits with banks. Cash equivalents are short-term balances (with an original maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition), highly liquid investments that are readily convertible into known amounts of cash and which are subject to insignificant risk of changes in value.

2.4. Earnings Per Share:

Basic earnings per equity share is computed by dividing the net profit/loss for the year attributable to the Equity Shareholders by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year.

2.5. Taxes:

- Current Tax: Provision for current tax is made based on the taxable income computed for the year under the Income Tax Act, 2.5.1.
- Deferred Tax: Deferred tax is recognised on timing differences, being the difference between the taxable income and 2.5.2. accounting income that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods. Deferred tax is measured using the tax rates and tax laws enacted or substantially enacted as at the reporting date. Deferred tax liabilities are recognised for all timing differences. Deferred tax assets are recognised only if there is a virtual certainty supported by convincing evidence that there will be sufficient future taxable income available to realise the assets. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at each balance sheet date for their realisabliity.

2.6. Provisions, Contingent liabilities, Contingent assets and Commitments:

Provisions are recognised when the Company has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event, it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. When the Company expects some or all of a provision to be reimbursed, for example, under an insurance contract, the reimbursement is recognised as a separate asset, but only when the reimbursement is virtually certain. The expense relating to a provision is presented in the statement of profit and loss net of any reimbursement.

If the effect of the time value of money is material, provisions are discounted using a current pre-tax rate that reflects, when appropriate, the risks specific to the liability. When discounting is used, the increase in the provision due to the passage of time is recognised as a finance cost.

Contingent liability is disclosed in the case of:

- a present obligation arising from past events, when it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation;
- a present obligation arising from past events, when no reliable estimate is possible;
- a possible obligation arising from past events, unless the probability of outflow of resources is remote.

Commitments include the amount of purchase order (net of advances) issued to parties for completion of assets. Provisions, contingent liabilities, contingent assets and commitments are reviewed at each balance sheet date.

2.7. Significant accounting judgements, estimates and assumptions

The preparation of the Company's financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of revenues, expenses, assets and liabilities, and the accompanying disclosures, and the disclosure of contingent liabilities. Uncertainty about these assumptions and estimates could result in outcomes that require a material adjustment to the carrying amount of assets or liabilities affected in future periods.

The key assumptions concerning the future and other key sources of estimation uncertainty at the reporting date, that have a significant risk of causing a material adjustment to the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities within the next financial year, are described below. The Company based its assumptions and estimates on parameters available when the financial statements were prepared. Existing circumstances and assumptions about future developments, however, may change due to market changes or circumstances arising that are beyond the control of the Company. Such changes are reflected in the assumptions when they occur.

Impairment of financial assets

The impairment provisions for financial assets are based on assumptions about risk of default and expected loss rates. The Company uses judgement in making these assumptions and selecting the inputs to the impairment calculation, based on Company's past history, existing market conditions as well as forward looking estimates at the end of each reporting period.
